Day Resource Center

- Point of entry for persons experiencing homelessness.
- Serving as a Coordinated Entry site ensuring persons get the right assistance at the right time
- Where clients get that initial assessment for need and appropriateness for other programs and services.



Emergency Overnight Shelter

- •Only non-restrictive overnight emergency shelter system in Lake County.
- •15 rotating shelter sites are open every night between October 1 and April 30. From May 1 through September 30, a single shelter site is open every night.
- Includes a dedicated space and support for families.



Prevention & Diversion

- Works to provide an earlier intervention for persons who are "near homeless."
- By working with them earlier, we can help them avoid becoming homeless and stay in the housing they are already in



Outreach

- Seeks to find and engage persons experiencing homelessness out in the community, sleeping in cars, tents, or elsewhere.
- We literally meet them where they are, and help engage them into services.



Housing

- Housing First program, in which people "crowdfund" an apartment for a chronically homeless person.
- PADS assists the individual in securing housing, and then provides ongoing case management to help them stay in it.
- $\bullet \textbf{Supportive housing program for chronically homeless persons with disabilities, funded by HUD. } \\$

Setting Goals

Moving clients through emergency shelter to residential stability is a multilayered process. Some clients have special needs that must be addressed prior to successful housing placement. However, PADS will achieve this goal through its own internal programs and collaborative partnerships with other organizations in the Lake County Coalition for the Homeless.

The two primary goals that all clients share are:

Increasing Income

This can be done through a variety of means, including getting job training, education, identification of new employment opportunities, and so on. It can also be done for persons with disabilities by getting them signed up for mainstream benefits for which they may be

eligible, such as Social Security or Disability Income.

Finding a Housing Solution

Even in the cases where income may increase, housing remains out of reach for many people in Lake County, as there is a significant lack of affordable housing. There are unfortunately not enough housing options accessible to our population, but our case managers work to help them identify options, including transitional housing, subsidized housing, room sharing, or other options.

Clients may have individual goals based on their individual needs, but all relate to these two goals.

Exits to Housing

While we work to get people out of shelter, where they go is an important measure of success. In the past year, we had the following:

- Long-term housing option— 47%
- Short-term housing option—28%
- Nursing Homes, hospitals, etc—5%
- Unknown (leave without reporting) —43%

With many of the "unknowns," they do find housing—but don't often report it to us. It's their last priority to let us know when they have secured that housing option.

LENGTH OF STAY

One goal of PADS is to reduce the amount of time that people stay in shelter and move them into housing or other supportive programs quickly. The median length of stay in shelter is about 21 days—with 36% of people served staying less than 7 days.

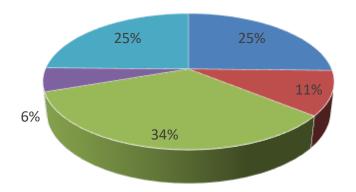

Summary of Financial Results

We are pleased to report that PADS has received a "clean" or "unqualified" audit opinion once again this year. From an audit perspective, this is the highest level an organization can accomplish. We are very proud of the effort that went into this achievement. There are still some things to point out regarding our financial health, which is due in part to your continued support and to sound financial management. The statements on the preceding pages tell part of the story; but we want to tell more.

Operating Results

This past year, PADS had a minor deficit that was largely due to timing of expenses and receipt of gifts. While our goal is to always end with total unrestricted revenues exceeding our total expenses for the year, we are proud of the result this year. We invested some money in some needed projects—a new phone system; financial accounting system; and donor database. Each of these investments were timed for the summer so as to not interfere with operations. The result, however, was a minor deficit. We do not anticipate another deficit in the future due to our cost controls, fund diversification and strategic use of past surplus dollars. We hope to continue to generate additional revenue in order to make future needed investments.

Availability of Liquid Reserves

An organization's Liquid Unrestricted Net Assets – also referred to as "operating reserves" – is the portion of unrestricted net assets that can be converted to cash relatively easily. It is a measure of funds available to an organization for guarding against downturns, pursuing new opportunities, and providing working capital in times of low cash flow. This is the portion of Unrestricted Net Assets not designated by the Board of Directors for a particular purpose, or otherwise invested in fixed assets.

It is the goal of PADS to have between 3-6 months of operating reserves, a recommended benchmark for non-profit organizations. We are proud, especially in light of this difficult and unknown climate related to government funds, to have created an operating reserve of over 3 months.

Plans for the Future

PADS is currently in a stable financial position and will continue to focus on improving its financial position for long term sustainability. This will allow us to pursue new opportunities to better serve the many men, women and children who experience homelessness each year. If for no other reason, we owe it to them to ensure our continued stability.
